SDIC Monthly Managers Report

7/21/2022

Infrastructure:

-Evans Pump #1 repairs have begun. The RFP's are being distributed and pump removal prep is underway.

-Evan's pump house roof replacement was completed. Warranty inspection was completed and signed. Final payment has been released.

Operations:

-GSI was able to complete the GIS overlay of the SDIC so I was able to complete the 2022 assessment and submit the LB-50 to the County.

-Vegetation control activities are ongoing. Large Blackberry growths have been removed along the southern end of the sub-levee, along the landward toe near the barge canal; and around the North Pump station. More areas of small trees were cut, chipped and hauled away.

-Evans pump level is set to 3.7'-4.4', finally starting to pump less often.

-Kessi-Hovan-Sternberg-Cherry-North-Johnson-Smith-Honeyman set to 1.5'-2.0' Infrastructure & Operations-Looking Ahead / Action Items:

-Vegetation control activities will continue. Grass mowing will progress towards the southern end of the perimeter levee. Mechanical blackberry removal will continue along the perimeter levee. Small tree removal operations will also continue, working north to south.

Personnel:

-Laurie Mapes resigned her employment with the SDIC. Thank you Laurie, for your tremendous help during my time at the SDIC.

408's:

-I have been notified by the USACE that funding for the national 408 program has been exhausted for the fiscal year, most 408's that are not petitioner funded have been put on hold until the new fiscal year in October.

-7/20/22 Ross Foster moved the Project Management of the Cadman/Ellis Farm 408 to Megan Simon. -Cadman Materials/USACE had a Geotech meeting on 6-2-2022. Most forward progress is awaiting the geotechnical borings scheduled for summer 2022. 7/11/22 I received word from Ross that the single phase 408 for the borings was given a no alteration decision.

-Cadman has submitted some follow up questions to the SDIC regarding infrastructure. I have been in the process of fulfilling this request.

-Cal Portland has submitted their final data package to the USACE. Official alteration determination is still in progress.

Accreditation / Lomar:

-Sauvie Island Drainage Improvement Company(SIDIC), FEMA, Multnomah County and Columbia County will be holding a meeting around June 30 to complete the IDA and LOMAR for the SIDIC. Columbia County, the City of Scappoose and the SDIC are hopeful this can serve as a blueprint for completing the IDA/LOMAR process. This meeting was postponed.

-The City of Scappoose on 7/15/2022 emailed that they had submitted the grant application to Business Oregon to fund the expanded IDA analysis by WEST.

Best Practices:

-This has been the first time the SDIC has transitioned multiple board and staff email and Microsoft 365 accounts. We have been in the process of setting up Rob H. new email and Micro 365 account. Scappoose Storm Water Master Plan:

-After Jeff M reached out to the city regarding the progress of the Master Plan after the 6/9/2022 board meeting, we received an email from Alexandra Rains that the introductory meeting in the winter of 2021 was the extent of the SDIC involvement and that they are expecting a draft from Brown and Caldwell in September of 2022 and the SDIC will be provided a copy and is welcome to participate in the public meetings held by the City Council.

Mercury TMDL:

-Willamette Basin Mercury TMDL is in process. SDIC, Sauvie Island DIC, and MCDD are working collaboratively on this initial plan. SIDIC submitted a plan that incorporated a modification to the O&M manual. Initial responses indicate that this was considered a good start, but a stand-alone plan will be needed.

Action Items:
